A list and brief description of the initiatives undertaken pursuant to the FCC rules based upon the FCC Menu Items are:

Menu Item 14) Provision of training to management level personnel as to the methods of ensuring equal employment opportunity and preventing discrimination.

Menu Item 16) Participation in other activities designed by the station reasonably calculated to further the goal of disseminating information as to employment opportunities in broadcasting to job candidates who might otherwise be unaware of such opportunities.

Menu Item 17) To give our signal free and without charge or obligation to non-profit schools, community organizations, and similar organizations so that their students and their listeners can become familiar with classical music and radio stations which broadcast classical music thereby creating an early interest in students to consider a career in music and/or broadcasting.

September 6, 2005 - WCPE receives notice of the upcoming *Youth In Business Day* scheduled for November 17, 2005. WCPE Program Director offers to host up to 3 students, extending our willingness to participate to 4 years in a row. (Menu item #4)

A 1974 graduate of NC State University (Liberal Arts) has been volunteering with WCPE since October 2002. November 15, 2005 WCPE Program Director conducts a Second (makeup) Volunteer Announcer audition and training session.

November 29, 2005 WCPE Program Director conducts Volunteer Announcer training sessions.
