E.J. Monk, arr. by Stephen Cleobury: Angel-voices ever singing

- Composer: Edwin George Monk (1819-1900)
- Arranger: Stephen Cleobury (1948-2019)
- Performers: Choir of King's College, Cambridge; Sir Stephen Cleobury (conductor); Richard Gowers (organ)
- "Angel-voices ever singing" is a beautiful choral work based on a hymn tune composed by Edwin George Monk.
